- Common official phone numbers frequently published by United and trusted outlets include:
 - Reservations / General Customer Service (U.S.): 1-800-855-4105 (1-800-UNITED-1). Use the telephone numbers shown on United's Contact pages for your region.

Is 1-888-855-4105 legitimate?

Our checks did not find this number on United's official contact or reservations pages. That absence is a red flag. United's primary published U.S. reservation/assistance lines and MileagePlus contacts appear on its Help and Contact pages — but 1-888-855-4105 is not listed there.

Reports of complex call-center scams tied to airline contact lines exist. If you suspect fraud, contact United via numbers on [united.com](https://www.united.com) and notify your bank immediately.

How to verify a United phone number (step-by-step)

1. Go to [United.com](https://www.united.com) → Help / Contact pages and locate the phone number for your country/region.

2. Compare the full number you were given (digits, country code, and formatting).
3. Check for official email domains (e.g., @united.com).
4. Use the official chat/text options on United.com.
5. If asked for unusual payment methods (gift cards, Zelle, crypto), stop immediately.

What to do if you've already called 1-888-855-4105 (or similar)

1. Stop further payments.
2. If you gave card details, contact your bank.
3. Contact United via official channels and report the incident.
4. File a police report and contact your national consumer protection agency.

Best practices when calling airlines

- Use numbers shown on the airline's official website.
- Keep calls short if something feels off; call back using the verified number.
- Use credit cards (not debit) for bookings.
- Use official apps or websites to verify bookings.

Final recommendations

If you see a suspicious number in search results, don't call it — verify on United.com.
